### From STEM to STEAM

In 2015 the release of Promotion of STEM Education Report paved the path that leads STEM education to each and every school in Hong Kong. STEM short for Science, Technology, engineer, and Mathematics has been embedded among Hong Kong schools for over eight years. After eight years of rapid development and integrating with Arts, STEM now has become STEAM as one of the key knowledge of school curriculum and will never ceases to slow down its progress.

### **STEAM Everywhere?**

San Wui Commercial Society School promotes STEAM with a holistic approach as follows:

#### Curriculum

To develop STEAM on a whole-school curriculum level our school subjects Mathematics, GS, I.T and English have been collaborating with the STEAM department aiming at strengthening and cultivation knowledge of coding, 3-D model making, printing, as well as information literacy.

### Activities

Aiming to strengthen the provision of STEM learning experiences to students our school has been planning and collaboration with quality providers to hold events like STEAM Day and LEGO STEM Day.

### STEAM Everywhere

In order to create a STEAM-everywhere school, we have set up STEAM corners at different floors. Here are our provisional STEAM corners:

- o Microscope Everywhere unveils the wonder world of microbiology.

- Planting Everywhere unlocks the knowledge of hydroponics and encourage students to explore in natural science.
